TCNA Amendment 2 with Calvert School

Last Friday, April 13 representatives from the Tuscany -Canterbury Neighborhood Association (TCNA), the Tuscany-Lombardy Community Corporation (TLCC), the Gardens of Guilford Condominium (the Gardens), and the Ridgemede and the Ridgewood Condominium Association signed an agreement with Calvert School. The agreement gives Calvert permission to purchase the wooded land in the 200-300 blocks of Tuscany Road. The agreement also permits Calvert to construct a building for educational purposes in the eastern part of the property. The agreement further obligates the community to not oppose Calvert's acquisition and to notify governmental

authorities, such as the Baltimore City Planning Commission, of the communities' agreement with Calvert.

Calvert has submitted a concept plan that outlines the general plans for the educational building and for the remainder of the Woods. The plan will be reviewed in front of the Baltimore City Planning Commission at a hearing on Thursday, April 19. The hearing will begin at 1:30 p.m. at 417 E. Fayette Street, 8th Floor (this particular item will not be heard until 2:00 p.m. or later). The Associations will notify the Planning Commission of their support of Calvert's purchase and plans to construct a building (see more below). This is an open meeting so anyone can attend and, although the hearing process is always interesting, it is not necessary for residents to be there.

The property is zoned Residential District 1 (RD1). This designation is similar to the zoning of properties on Warrenton Road and brings with it a number of limitations on the use of the land. In the next few weeks Calvert will be applying to the Zoning Board for a Conditional Use for educational purposes. The Associations will support this, too. We will notify you when the date for the Zoning Board has been firmed up.

The Agreement is more than 8 pages long and includes a number of provisions that have been explained in greater detail at meetings held over the last several months. The most notable provisions are:

- Creation of buffer zones of heavily forested land along the Tuscany Road and Tuscany Court sides of the property. The buffered zones run for 70 feet from the Tuscany Road curb, and for 50 feet from the Tuscany Court alley property line. The purpose of the buffer zone is to provide screening and to mitigate run off.
- Appointment of a Project Committee to review Calvert School's designs for the new building. This Committee will also serve as liaison between the community and the school during construction.
- Construction guidelines similar to those the neighborhood used during Calvert's construction of the addition to its lower school in 2009.
- Limiting ingress and egress from Tuscany Road.

The terms of this Agreement will run for 20 years.

This is our third Agreement with Calvert School. When Calvert purchased property on the north side of Tuscany Road in order to construct its Middle School in 2001, the community and Calvert entered into Covenants that run until 2026. The First Amendment to the Covenants occurred in 2008 when Calvert built the addition to its Lower School on Canterbury Road. Last Friday's Agreement is the Second Amendment to the Covenants and will be posted on the TCNA website along with the Covenants and First Amendment. Planning Commission Hearing: Thursday, April 19. 2:00PM

Calvert School has a concept plan for a 12,000 square ft building on the new property the school is buying. The Tuscany-Canterbury Association will provide a letter of support for this concept plan. This support is part of the agreement between Calvert School and TCNA, The Gardens of Guilford, Tuscany/Lombardy Co-Op, and the Ridgemede/Ridgewood Condos.

Another Planning Commission Hearing will be held in the future to approve the full development plan for the new building. Calvert School will also be requesting a zoning hearing in May to approve a request for Conditional Use for an Education Facility and a zoning variance to increase the building height from 35 ft to 40 ft. Tuscany-Canterbury and the other groups will also be providing support for this request, also as part of our agreement.

Broadview Apartments Calming Plan 39th Street -- Phase 2

The owners of the Broadview Apartments are continuing their plan to calm traffic on 39th Street between Canterbury Road and University Avenue. Preliminary plans were presented to a group of stakeholders on 28 March 2018. The plans, which have not been finalized, call for at least three crosswalks and associated signage. The Broadview owners are also considering placing tables and chairs in the median strip to make the area more pedestrian- friendly and neighborhood-oriented.

Dangerous Crossing University Parkway and Tudor Arms

On 12 April 2018, Councilwoman Mary Pat Clarke convened a meeting of citizens concerned about unsafe conditions at the crosswalk located at the intersection of University Parkway and Tudor Arms Avenue. Traffic engineer Graham Young from the Department of Transportation (DOT) proposed an interim modification to traffic patterns that would include pavement markings and flex posts.

Permanent modifications would be constructed at a later date. The longer-range plan calls for decreasing traffic lanes to one in each direction, increasing sight lines for pedestrians, widening the bike lane, and improving signage. Young emphasized that this plan would conform to the city's Protected Bike Lane Master Plan.

During the meeting it was also revealed that speed humps are to be installed on Tudor Arms Avenue, which is frequently used as a shortcut to avoid bottlenecks on Keswick Road.

Roland Park Bike Lanes

On12 April 2018, the DOT met community members at St. David's Church and presented a proposal to modify the Roland Avenue Cycle Track. The presentation can be viewed on the DOT's website here:

Attendees were quite vocal in opposition to the proposal, preferring instead that Roland Avenue be "put back the way it was."

Stony Run Clean-Up

On 7 April 2018, several members of the TCNA joined with neighbors on Wickford Road to participate in Project Steam Clean of Stony Run between Overhill Road and University Parkway. Neighbors braved snow flurries to cut down and remove about 20 trees of an invasive species. They also collected a pickup truck load of litter that was taken to the Sisson Street drop-off station. And they moved piles of trees and trimmings to the curb of Linkwood Road where it was picked up the following Friday.

Community Pitch-In Day / Dumpster Available

Every spring and fall, TCNA coordinates with the City to provide a dumpster for the community's convenience, saving people a trip to the landfill.



Do not put hazardous materials in the dumpster. Take them instead to the Sisson Street landfill. And rather than put metal and electronics into the dumpster, you can recycle them at the Sisson Street landfill. The landfill is on Sisson Street just south of 29th Street and is open Monday through Saturday.

UPDATE: Construction at Ambassador Apartments

The brick wall is completed. However the rest of the project will not be completed by June 1, as had been anticipated. Between now and July, the pavers, dirt, and sod will need to be put in place. All the debris will be removed. During the summer the construction on the garden will be completed. In the fall mature trees and bushes will be planted. (This will help ensure that they survive through the winter.) Then a ramp sidewalk and fence will be installed in order for residents and neighbors to enter through the back of the building.



After everything is completed, the dumpsters will be removed and the sidewalks and parking will again be available.

Monthly Crime Safety Tip

Lock your cars and don't leave anything visible inside.

In the fall a number of cars in the neighborhood were broken into. Almost all were unlocked. After a concerted effort to
